Grateful in San Rafael

WE WERE **INTRODUCED** то BATEY SAN RAFAEL two years ago, through our relationship with Feed my Starving Children (FMSC). San Rafael is about 15 minutes outside of Isabela, the most distant community we serve, and it is one of the most materially poor communities we serve. Our Food Distribution Program began providing fortified rice meals (Manna Packs) from FMSC around mid-2019. Following a positive response from our supporters in late 2019, we were able to add beans to their distribution.

For nearly two years now, the San Rafael community has been fully incorporated into our Food Distribution. God's perfect timing ensured that residents of the community had sufficient food before

and during the most difficult months of the Covid-19 pandemic, even as many other organizations paused their services.

As our distribution team established a routine for San Rafael, getting to know leaders and community members, a woman named Gloria stood out to them. Gloria is usually one of the first to greet the team, and insists on helping to set up. She moves chairs and helps to carry things in from the truck, despite a physical condition that limits the use of her right arm.

Gloria explains that she wants to offer her help as a way to express her gratitude for the help that is brought into her community. She has six children and cares for two grandchildren. "Thank you very much!"

The operating costs for our Food Distribution Program have increased in recent months. We are faced with higher prices for rice, beans, and eggs purchased in the Dominican Republic, and shipping costs for the food donated by Feed My Starving Children have increased more than 20%.

Profile: Pastor Alexandra, Batey 9

This is the third in a series of profiles on Pastors and church leaders in the bateys served by The Least of These Ministries.

BATEY 9 IS ONE OF SEVERAL communities served by The Least of These Ministries that is only accessible by dirt roads between fields of sugar cane. When the cane has grown tall, it can seem like riding through a maze. The third largest community in our Food Distribution program, around 80 families in Batey 9 are served, representing some 500 people.

When our DR Ministry staff began distributing the food through local churches several years ago, we did not have a connection to a church in Batey 9. A Pastor at one of the community's churches learned of our need and approached our Manager, Ricardo, to make her church available to us.

"The doors of our church are open to you because this

feeding program is a blessing from God in this community," Pastor Alexandra told Ricardo at the time. "I see it in this way and I know many people see it in this way too, since there are many people in need who are part of this program. And I can see that they are grateful."

Pastor Alexandra is 47 years old, and is married to William, who is also a Pastor at the church. Alexandra and William have two children—Natanael, age 25, and Lisandra, age 16. Alexandra was

She holds a degree in Nursing from the Catholic Technical University in Barahona (UCATEBA). She chose that profession as a way to further help her community, as she has a passion for serving others.

Alexandra says she is grateful for the Food Distribution program as it helps her to reach more people

with the gospel message and identify needs in the community of which she otherwise may not be aware. The distributions are also an ideal time for her to announce church and community activities.

She says that, to her, it feels like we are "a family with the same objectives: sowing the seeds of Jesus in the hearts of the people and helping the needy."
