knows the importance of incorporating fun into activities in order to hold the kids' attention. Wilton, our Director of Evangelism & Social Action, knows this quite well—he has two young adult sons and has a lot of experience leading youth activities.

He had an opportunity to put that experience to work at a recent outreach in Batey Santa Maria. Wilton and Ricardo led separate activities for younger kids and older teenagers. The activities were intended to help the young people realize the importance of reading the bible and gain a level of comfort in studying God's word.

The younger kids were led in an activity to get them into the bible and then participated in a 'Bible

Tournament,' where they could win small prizes for successfully looking up answers to questions.

Wilton and Ricardo led a bible study with the teenagers, followed by a discussion of the value of working together on common issues.

Ministry Holds Second Prison Outreach

NEYBA, THE CAPITAL CITY OF THE BAORUCO PROVINCE, is located about 14 miles northwest of Batey 2. That puts the city at well over an hour drive from our Ministry Hub in the city of Barahona. Neyba is located close to Lake Enriquillo, which is the largest lake in the Caribbean, according to Wikipedia.

In June, Pastor Ramón and Wilton visited the municipal jail in Neyba with several volunteers. Ramón and Wilton planned the visit in coordination with Pastors in Neyba who minister at the jail. These Pastors participated in the event, and each was invited to join in our Pastor Training Program as future classes are held. They were very receptive to the invitation!

Wilton and Ramón both gave bible teachings to the group of men and led them in a time of worship and prayer. The men were prayed for and encouraged to attend church services offered in the jail. The ministry team also spent some time playing basketball with the men, taking time to get to know a little about each one.




The visitors brought with them gift bags for each resident of the jail. The bags were packed by volunteers at Pastor Ramón's church in Batey Los Robles, and contained personal hygiene items such as soap, a toothbrush, and toothpaste. Each man also received a copy of the New Testament. The Neyba Pastors who helped to set up the visit each received a new study bible. The gifts were made possible through a generous donation from one of our supporters.

With its close proximity to many of the communities we serve, men who are arrested in these communities would likely be held at the Neyba jail. It is our desire that all the incarcerated men at the jail, regardless of their home community, would hear about and see the hope that Jesus offers, and would come to know Him as their Savior!







Will You Help Us Share Hope through Safe Housing?

OUR MINISTRY HAS RECEIVED two specific requests for help related to housing in recent months. While housing is not a primary outreach for us, we always prayerfully consider requests from those in need.

<u>The first request</u> came from Pastor Leonardo in Santa Maria. Rubelania, a single mother of four, needs a safe, dry home for her family. Currently, only her 7 year-old son lives with her due to her financial and housing situation. The home she currently rents has a very leaky roof, and is generally not a very safe structure.



Rubelania told Ricardo, "I cry when I have to wake up at 1 AM, 2 AM, at any time when the heavy rain starts. It hurts me when my son asks me, 'Mommy, when are we going to have a house that doesn't get wet when it rains?' I just tell him, 'my son, God, one day will give us a house; let's have faith." She continued, "The food program has helped us with food, and in the preaching during the distribution they help me to trust God every

day and know that He is the one who provides."

Leonardo and the church have made land available and constructed a frame for a new home for Rubelania and her family, but they lack the resources to complete it. Leonardo asked Ricardo if the ministry would consider helping with the project. In response, we will be

sending a mission team in October to build the home for Rubelania and her family!

<u>The second request</u> is from a member of Ricardo's church on the mountain. Many past team members may have met Sonia and her family while attending service at the church. Sonia's home was built many years ago by another organization. In recent years, parts of the ceiling started cracking and falling off. More recently, large chunks of the concrete roof started falling in (it was determined that insufficient re-bar was

used in the construction, and the concrete may not have been mixed properly).

Sonia and her husband want to replace that concrete roof with a corrugated metal roof.

Although the metal roof is significantly less costly than a new concrete roof, they still lack sufficient resources to complete the project, and have asked if the ministry can

help. We want to help them as we feel that we are members of their church family. That church community has welcomed our teams and served them for many years!
