IN OUR MARCH NEWSLETTER, Board member Jacki Stranathan told the story of a family who lost their home to a fire early this year. The father of the five children constructed a frame for a new house on property that was donated to the family, then added a roof. Sadly, the father passed away unexpectedly some time after doing that work.

Jacki extended an invitation to join a Mission Team that would be serving the week after Easter. The team's project would be completing the house for

Renata and her five children. Twelve people answered that call, including two family groups of three!

The team, working with a great crew of local builders and helpers, and equipped with \$1,020 of additional funds raised for the project, completed the home in four days of work! When the team left, only the doors needed to be hung and electricity brought to the home.

In addition to the home construction, team members participated in the Food Distribution each day and children's activities in two communities.

Ministry Hub Progress

IN OUR CONTINUING EFFORT to improve the exterior appearance of our Ministry Hub in Barahona, Ricardo recently hired a local sign painter to add the ministry name and logo to the front and side exterior walls. This is the first time the building has been publicly identified as housing the ministry. We strive to be a witness to our neighbors in the local area and identifying the organization as a Christian ministry will support that goal. It is also a goal that local donors would support the work being done by the ministry, and



increasing our visibility in Barahona will help in that regard.



Future plans are to include graphic depictions of bible stories in open areas of the exterior walls, adding to the witness to the community!

The local construction crew will soon be starting the work to pour the concrete slab that will form the second floor. We anticipate that work to be finished by late summer, allowing us to begin the build out of the ground floor with a mission team in October. Framing and drywall to create the reception area and dining/meeting room will be done by the team, working with a local construction crew.

How is God calling you to serve?

Summer Mission Team	Service project: Expand an existing church building in one of the bateys.
August 2–9, 2025	Experience working with concrete block is helpful, but not required!
Fall Mission Team	Service project: Framing & drywall construction on the ground floor of the Ministry Hub.
October 18–25, 2025	May include electrical/network wiring & plumbing.
Winter Mission Team January 10–17, 2026	Service project: Depending on team size, we may work on 2nd floor of Ministry Hub and a service project in a batey simultaneously.

Mission Teams will also include opportunities to serve with the daily food distribution ministry, children's activities, and evangelistic outreach! Mission Team participation is \$725 plus airfare.
